Weather Kills Homeless Man on Berkeley Streets

Gray Panthers of the East Bay were appalled to learn about the man found dead on the morning of February 6, near Shattuck & Bancroft, apparently due to exposure from being out in the cold rain A long-term solution to our homeless problem needs to be found, but during periods of severe weather is not the time to carry on policy debates. People out on the streets during these times must have access to shelter.

We take indigent people to a hospital emergency room to save their lives; we should also save the lives of street people during bad weather. We should not abandon anyone to die in these conditions. The City-run homeless shelters are a temporary expedient, given that we can't provide long-term housing to these people. But if we provide the shelters, we should also **make sure** that the homeless people who need to use the shelters know what the hours of operation are.
